## Carrot River Valley Watershed Association and Saskatchewan Association of Watersheds "Water Conservation" Poster Contest

Thank you for expressing interest in the Saskatchewan Association of Watersheds Annual Poster Contest! The Carrot River Watershed in which you live is one of 11 provincial watershed stewardship associations participating in this year's contest. The Carrot River Valley Watershed Association (CRVWA) will be providing prizes for the top 3 local winners selected from entrants that live within our watershed. ## Contest details:

- 1. Contest is open to youth in grades 5, 6 and 7 that attend school within the Carrot River Watershed. A list of eligible schools is available from the CRVWA office. All entries should reflect a Water Conservation theme.
- 2. Formatting guidelines:

Artwork must be 100% hand-drawn, original artwork on a  $8\%^{\prime\prime}$  X  $11^{\prime\prime}$  white piece of paper.

Any medium may be used (pencil crayon, paint, wax crayon, marker, etc.).

- 3. Posters will be judged based on the following criteria:
  - Accuracy and knowledge of information presented within the poster (i.e. illustrations demonstrate the student's understanding of the topic).
  - The artwork demonstrates an appreciation of water conservation.
  - General artistic ability and creativity.

- 5. All entries must be received before 4pm on **Friday, March 17, 2017**, the closing date of the contest.

- 7. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners of the local contest agree to have their name and poster published in CRVWA newsletters, crwatershed.ca, Facebook and Twitter.
- 8. Parent permission is required on all entries, and this Poster Contest Details sheet must be completed and attached to each entry. Only one entry per child.
- 9. Judges at the local level will be CRVWA staff and board members. The decision of the judges is final. All winners will be notified by telephone.
- 10. Provincial judging will occur in Esterhazy on April 6, 2017 in conjunction with the Saskatchewan Association of Watersheds Annual Conference.
